Sustainable transport options for people and freight across inner Melbourne</p>	<p>Daniel Bowen (Public Transport Users' Association) and Paul Mees (RMIT University) presented on sustainable transport options for people and freight across inner Melbourne, and what needs to be done to achieve this...</p> <p>Daniel Bowen – key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improve public transport in outer suburbs, i.e. better services, better connections, timetable coordination, more frequent services • Need something that is affordable and makes a difference. Put aside Melbourne Metro rail – too expensive • East West road will only bring traffic, i.e. won't relieve congestion • In favour of Doncaster rail line • Responsibility of all, not only PTUA, to watch out... <p>Paul Mees – key points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Need for new rail lines, especially, Monash University Rowville, Melbourne Airport and Doncaster • Ratchet up campaign to sophisticated level, i.e. properly costed and put together technical case drawing on good examples from other states • Grassroots campaigning • Fix governance in public transport 	<p>Rose to let Daniel and Paul know what working group plans to do</p> <p>Rose to link Katie to Cr Alison Clarke re: City of Yarra transport campaign/reference group</p>

Working together</p>	<p>Action that has already occurred</p> <p>On 28 March, representatives of Protectors of Public Lands Victoria Inc (PPL) and the Royal Park Protection Group Inc. independently travelled to Canberra to put the case to the Federal Government not to fund the Baillieu Government's proposed East West Link but to improve public transport.</p> <p>What else needs to be done?</p> <p>1. Short-term – Community campaign</p> <p>Group were in general agreement that work needs to be done to bust basic East West Link myths in the short term, i.e. before Budget is handed down in May. General agreement that it would be beneficial for residents groups to start lobbying their council</p>	<p>Rose to organise small group meeting before next working group meeting</p> <p>Small group to decide on urgent action needed, e.g. action needed before budget</p>

	<p>2. Long term- Transport 'package' General agreement that a transport 'package' needs to be put together.</p> <p>Who should do it? Proposed that a smaller group meet before the next working group meeting to flesh out short-term actions. This group to include Rose, Gabby, Katie, Freda (or other YCAT rep)</p>
